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## **North Hill Chiropractic History**

Our office originated, obviously, as a personal residence. It was built in 1960.

In 1984 Mark Webb, D.C. leased the building using the upstairs as his personal residence and remodeling the downstairs for healthcare services. The north half of the building was used by Dr. Webb who started North Hill Chiropractic Center. He sub leased the south side to Olympic Sport and Spine Rehabilitation.

Dr. Rogers purchased Dr. Webb's practice in 1989 and renamed the office North Hill Chiropractic also living in the upstairs. Olympic Sport and Spine Rehabilitation had left the office in 1988. Dr. Rogers added massage therapy to the clinic and continues to lease space to massage practitioners to this day.

In 1992 Dr. Rogers and his wife purchased the building and began remodeling. This included expanding the back parking lot and adding two new therapy rooms in previous open space on the south end while moving the waiting room from the north side to its current central location. In 2001 the southeast therapy room was converted to full time spinal rehabilitation and exercise training.

Needing more room, Dr. Rogers and his family moved out of the upstairs converting it to additional office space. Pam Nordeen L.M.P. then moved her massage practice from downstairs to the northwest upstairs office. Acupuncture was also added when Robert Call L.A.C. joined our group the same year.

In 2010 construction started on our stretch of Highway 161 in the form of sewers and road widening. The effects of this change continue as we expand our parking downstairs while losing most on Meridian. Signage is also in transition as the DOT purchased the property that our free standing brick sign once occupied.
